I am not sure exactly why the official Pride Week events were cancelled. Like many of you I have heard official stories and also rumours. In the end, it doesn't matter. I can't judge what happened, I simply don't have the facts. Pride events were cancelled and that makes me very sad.



Our congregation has been part of Pride for a very long time. I remember pushing my eldest daughter in her rainbow-festooned stroller 15 years ago. The girls called it the "Rainbow Parade" for the longest time. Along with Audrey Brooks and our Chorealis choir, I have sometimes been included in the Pride Sunday Service. It was always an honour.

I hope things come back, and that we remember that Pride is a celebration of diversity. Sure, there are always more issues to be resolved and more work to do, but I don't think that's a reason to stop celebrating what has been accomplished. The courageous story of the few people who gathered decades ago for that first, furtive two block march, some of them masked for self-protection, reminds me of just how far we have come. Watching the faces of people being so free and so happy while freely expressing themselves has always made me smile.

I don't know how it will all turn out, but it would be a shame if we didn't find some way to celebrate again in the future.

In the meantime, I am proud that our UCE Youth Group has stepped up and decided that they want to offer Pride service in the church on Sunday, June 9th. I will be there, dressed in a colourful manner and smiling, and maybe crying with pride.

Karen Bilida was responsible for advertising with revolving pictures on Kijiji for several days prior to and during the sale. To serve our delicious hot-dogs and pop were Chefs Maurice Bourgoin (who braved the snow) on Friday and Brian Kiely and David Rae on Saturday.

Special recognition to our WH Alexander Award winners, the Wednesday crew who willingly helped with setup, cleanup and so many other jobs I managed to find for them.

Gaylord Madill kept us informed of the running total during the sale and then he and Edwina had the challenge of counting over \$9700! Our sale also benefits other organizations. Edwina Madill took all the leftover vases to the gift shop at the Grey Nuns Hospital to be re-used for flower arrangements. Grant Harlton discovered that the Lion's Senior Centre was happy to take all our leftover books for their book sale so he delivered 2 full vans to them. The rest of the leftovers were picked up by Find which is a local Edmonton organization. It provides essential furnishings free of charge to individuals and families who are moving out of homelessness, and it also supplies low-cost, quality furniture and housewares for sale to the public.

The community gets involved in many ways. Shoppers say they wait eagerly for our sale each year because our prices are low and they often find treasures. On Friday morning, there were more than 20 people waiting for the doors to open at 8 am! The kids enjoy finding books and toys and many shoppers stop for a hot dog and pop.

### **Social Justice Working Group Update**

On April 28<sup>th</sup>, the UCE Social Justice Committee presented a service to receive and honour the new Indigenous Spirituality banner which will hang in the sanctuary alongside the other banners representing all the faiths from which we take our teachings. The banner was designed by Bent Arrow Traditional Healing Society, and Elder Rose Wabasca was present to share some of her teachings with us. Afterwards, we held a Soup Sunday and shared food and conversation together,

The event was intended to include an outdoor pipe ceremony before the service, and a tent was purchased to provide shelter in case of rain. Unfortunately, the ceremony had to be cancelled due to heavy snow! While we regret missing out on the pipe ceremony, we are happy to report that the church now owns a 10 x 20 foot tent, which I'm sure will see plenty of use at future events.

The Social Justice crew continues to operate the Food Bank hamper distribution on Wednesday nights, and we have been blessed with a wonderful crew of volunteers to help out! There is a sign-up sheet in the foyer for anyone who is interested in joining us, and we have tasks for every level of fitness.

Sunday Night Sidewalk Parties outside Hope Mission continue, and we attend on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month to bring food, clothing, water bottles and anything else we have to share with our less fortunate neighbours. Everyone is welcome to join us.

On May 9 members of UCE attended the Pro-Choice counter protest at the Alberta Legislature Grounds. There is another rally planned to defend Reproductive Rights on June 24<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm, please watch for more details on <u>Facebook</u>.

Affordable and accessible abortion and counselling services are available to some, but not to all Canadian women. The current situation is inequitable.







#### Welcome to UCE - An Accessible and Inclusive Place

We take pride in the easy access to our facility on many levels and we are always trying to improve our welcome.

No stairs to get in the building, no stairs to get into the Sanctuary, button-operated door at the front, accessible washrooms. Chairs in our Sanctuary are easily moved to accommodate multiple physical needs; portable audio receivers with headphones for any who need extra assistance, scent free; allergy aware.

In addition to our chairs in services we also have one or two meditation / activity tables which can be used by any person who needs some physical stimulation to help them listen.

We welcome people of all genders and identities and have signs posted inviting people to use the washroom that best suits them as well as a gender neutral washroom.

#### Social media allows for even more accesibility.

There are many people that can not physically make it to our building but we still want them to feel included in our community. Social media allows many people to be able to participate with us and keep up on UCE and UU news.

Changes to Facebook this year have made it very hard for pages to reach the people who have liked them, much less new folks.

We need your likes and comments to get Facebook to see our posts as important to their algorithm. Shares are great too; if you think your friends might appreciate seeing them.


#### CanUUdle Was a Hit


#### **Camping in Drumheller August with the Calgary Unitarians**
