#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### Power Church

Janet would like to be included in discussions involving Power Church, as she is the one who will be doing the work. Susan clarified that a small committee has been working on backlog which does not involve Janet. Janet is making a list of necessary changes to provide to Andrew Mills.

The new Member Directory will be Emailed to members. A suggestion was put forward to include pictures, however the Board agreed pictures will not be included. As well, members may request that particular details not be published and those requests will be honoured. There are various formats available – it was agreed the Board will be happy with whatever format used; if not we can change it next year.

#### Refugee Update

See Ministers Report attached. The parents are in full time English insruction. Mohamad is now at level 3. He will need to be at level 4 before seeking employment, which may happen in the spring.

David Rae inquired as to whether there are enough funds available to support the family as required. Susan clarified that we are required to provide support for 12 months. The

family is now receiving the Canada Child Benefit which has reduced the monthly amount from our funds, therefore we may well be able to continue our support for an additional 12 months.

#### Strategic Planning

The Property Management Committee has approved its terms of reference.

Janet and Mike Keast are working on putting UCE Board minutes on the UCE website.

With regard to the pet policy, Mike has not yet been able to pick up signs, but will do so in the near future. The reaction to the pet policy has been mostly positive.

Nonie brought to our attention the issue of conflict of interest with regard to the Finance Committee and Audit Committee. Susan will address this issue.

#### Compassionate Circle

Only 10 responses were received from the survey. The original survey questions were difficult to answer and have been revised. Unfortunately some of us did not realize the more recent Email contained a revised survey.

#### Bylaw Review Committee

Beth Jenkins has inquired about attending the December board meeting in order to get a start on bylaw review so that it will be ready to vote on at the AGM in May 2017. Karen will speak to Beth in this regard.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Mural from Change for Children

There was discussion as to whether the mural is in line with Unitarian principles. Nonie Buskie indicated she perceived the mural as having an angry and disturbing feel. On the other hand, Yvonne Mireau likes the mural and found it peaceful, so opinions vary. Mike Keast has talked to around 21 people, including the Grounds Committee and the Social Justice Committee, and the response has been positive.

Would we be custodians of the mural? Yes, same as for our building.

Would we be responsible for repair in the event of deterioration? Change for Children may assist with that.

Vandalism – The City of Edmonton has a fund to assist with removal of graffiti. The mural can be installed high enough to make it difficult for graffiti artists to reach.

Insurance - Change for Children is willing to sign an indemnity in our favour if necessary.

Mike is checking to see if there are any City of Edmonton regulations which might apply.

Before a decision is made, Mike will consult with the Esthetics Committee. As well, an Email will be sent to the general membership asking for comments with a deadline of Dec 1, 2016.

#### Notes on October 2016 UCE Financials

- 1. Our biggest donor now gives online every second month. October was a month this donor gave, so Identified Contributions are up for the month.
- 2. Total rental income is about \$5,000 lower than this time last year; don't know why. But still above what I budgeted.
- 3. Salary costs are higher than budgeted: Lauren worked an extra week in August. Janet got a raise Oct. 1.
- 4. Campus ministry: We have budgeted \$1,000 to support Rev. Anne Barker in campus ministry. She has spent \$650 already, but half of that is arranging parking for the year.
- 5. We have spent nearly \$600 on youth already, but that expense will come out of our Youth (YRUU) fund which has lots of money in it. Most of the expense was to take two carloads of kids to the Fall Gathering in Saskatoon.
- 6. Refugee fund has been depleted by a used car purchase the total cost of car, insurance, registration and AMA membership was about \$11,500. We can still support the family for 12 more months, at \$2,150 a month.
- 7. Horst is retiring from snow removal so we are looking for a company to do snow clearing. Cost will be within the \$2,000 budget (but Horst donated the money back, which won't happen now).
- 8. Should get our casino money this month.

Children/youth: We have on average about 16 that come on Sundays. Some don't respond at all and I have to rely on the youth themselves to respond. Not an ideal situation and takes lots of time.

Youth group is going well with us joining forces with Westwood. We are just working out some minor details at this point. We have three new youth advisors coming on board part time. They are Christina Keast, Bonnie McMillan and Alex Polkovsky. Brandie and Maria are in and out due to family and work schedules. So I am hoping this new team will be great for everyone.

Gathering/Youth con: The gathering for me was great. It was VERY emotional and informative. I really enjoyed making connections with other UUs and people involved in RE/CUC.

Youth con was great! It was exhausting for me, as I was doing both the gathering and youth at night. The youth really enjoyed themselves and are excited for the next one. We had 7 youth from UCE and 2 from WW. Janet, Brandie, Susan and I all drove or rode with them to Saskatoon.



Teachers/Volunteers: Vivian is wonderful and great with the kids. I have had no problems getting snacks provided by the congregation for classes. Having nursery "on call" volunteers has been working at this point as we don't have any little ones that come all the time.

Events: I am having a monthly event here at UCE. These are for everyone, all ages. Seeing as, mostly RE people came to the Halloween bash, I am going to market these events differently from now on. ADULT OWL: OWL is scheduled for November 21<sup>st</sup>. We did not have enough people registered last month for it to be successful so we rescheduled. Brian will be making announcements for this session as I am with the kids and cannot leave to come to service for this purpose. The first session will be on Sexual diversity and the following ones will be determined by interest from the participants. Shiraz and I will be facilitating these sessions as of now. Kat has offered her assistance as she is also an OWL facilitator. We have not yet worked out the details on her involvement.
