

### Monthly artist program

Elaine Reynard and Lillias Cowper want to coordinate a program, modeling it on the Westwood Congregation's Art program. They would contact potential artists and make arrangements to display one artwork piece along with a bio. Robert and Gordon will be consulted to determine how and where the artwork is displayed at UCE. They envision this as an opportunity to promote local artists and a community outreach program.

They would also provide a newsletter article explaining the Artist a Month program with pictures and bio.

The supplies needed: an easel and small table to place the bio.

### Prison Chaplain request

Deana Walters (pronounced Deena) is a serving chaplain but will likely lose her credentialing body support because of her views on same sex relationships...and the fact she is now in one.

She requires a legitimate body to fill in a form.

- She is not asking for compensation for us or any financial support. She is just trying to keep her job.
- She is willing to become modestly active at UCE and perhaps lead a service on prisons etc.
- Brian interviewed her for an hour and she came across very well. He has confidence in her as a minister and especially as a prison chaplain.

### To consider:

- 1. Completing the form would take a bit of fudging from us. She has no intention of seeking a licence to do weddings, that is not part of her work, but still we would have to say we authorize her...something the Lay Chaplaincy body nationally controls.
- 2. We would have to amend the part about compensation slightly to say she could be compensated for performing rites in accordance with our Lay Chaplaincy practices.

### **Recommendations for Sharing Our Abundance**

The Social Justice Working Group recommended the following changes from 2018 to 2019:

- Recipients for April and October are exchanged so that our donation to Child Haven International would come in October, when the Child Haven dinner is held.
- The Stephen Lewis Foundation is dropped from the list because the Foundation has grown immensely, and our funds could have more impact elsewhere.
- RISE (Reconciliation in Solidarity Edmonton) has been added to the list because it is a relatively
  new organization that undertakes important work related to reconciliation.

- Although the work of Camp fYrefly is being incorporated into another organization, we felt it is
  important to continue support for this work. Details about how the new organization will work
  have yet to be confirmed, so the situation will have to be monitored.
- CEASE is moved to July and RISE to December.

### **Building and Grounds Items for Discussion**

## **Drywalling staircase**

As per our last fire inspection we need to finish dry walling the inside of the staircase going up to the sound area. This job is outside the scope of our volunteers, so we need to outsource it. After many attempts to get a company to quote it, we have found one company that is willing to take it on for a cost of 6200 +GST

We are looking for board approval to go ahead.

### **AED**

As our population is increasing in age there is more of a chance that we could have a health crisis onsite. One device that has been shown to help is an AED (automatic electronic defibrillator). There is no training required but the device has been shown to save lives. Michelle Van Der Molen has sourced one out thru her suppliers and we are looking at 2475.20 plus GST

### Telsco after hours

Currently we have two contacts who take all the calls from Telsco after hours. (Mike Keast and Andrew Mills). The system works on a tree like system where they call the first person and if they can't reach them, go onto the next person. When they call they advise as to the type of alarm (door sensor or motion sensor) and the person called needs to advise whether they should send a guard to check things over or get ahold of someone to go down and attend the issue if it is safe to do so. We are in need of a couple more volunteers to be on the list. Will Adair has agreed to be a contact. The people will also have access to the camera system on their smart device so they can see what might be going on. (This should be working for everyone by Oct 31). We would like the board to find us 2 volunteers.

# Janitor update

After talking to the Staff and people around the Church I have heard the following in regards to the new Janitors

- -He is nice and easy to communicate with
- -He has a good system and knows what he is doing
- -It's nice to have the same consistent person
- -The floors are being vacuumed
- -The bathroom sinks have never looked so shiny
- -The chairs have been put out right
- -Everything looks clean to me
- -Quality assurance has been around a few times to check on things

My own personal observations are he does have a pattern of how he cleans and goes over everything, he is fast and efficient. I had stopped in to ask him to go through the Janitor room and let us know what was not being used or needed and he had already done that and put everything to the side that was not being used. There was still wax and cleaners from when Herbert was the Janitor.

The recommendation is to move forward and keep them as our Janitors.



# Bye-Bye, Debt

We bought the Brews warehouse 15 years ago for \$650,000. We paid \$200,000 to the owner, the Brews company, and arranged to pay the rest to Brews annually till the amount was paid off, in 2010.

Creating a beautiful church within this warehouse cost another \$825,000. Total cost of purchase and renos: nearly \$1.5 million (\$1,475,133).

We paid off this huge amount by:

- 1. Sale of our old building: net profit \$300,000
- 2. Taking \$120,000 from the Endowment Fund
- 3. Working casinos
- 4. A capital fund-raising campaign raised \$500,000
- 5. Other donations
- 6. Borrowing \$270,000 from friends and members through the sale of five-year debentures, starting in 2004.

On Sept. 15, 2018 we paid off the last of the debenture debt, using casino money for the principal amount and Endowment Fund money for the interest.

Today the Endowment Fund, which we emptied to buy the building, is over \$100,000. The value of our building has more than doubled, according to the City of Edmonton estimate of \$1.4 million.

And we are debt-free.
