- A person may be nominated for, or win, the award more than once.

Dear Unitarian Church of Edmonton!

These heartfelt wishes come your way from the Canadian Unitarian Council. A blessing for your journey taken from one of Vyda Ng's favorite poems.

Building community together takes commitment, energy, tenaciousness and courage. In these paraphrased words of Rev. Ray Drennan, it's like paddling a big canoe. He suggests that a few simple guidelines might be helpful:

"You have to show up, grab a paddle and step into the boat. Virtual paddling or instructions shouted from the shore are not helpful.

In our community of communities canoe there is room for both paddlers **and passengers. Everyone's presence is** needed as if any are missing, the canoe will be off balance.

Just because you have a paddle in your hand doesn't mean that you know how to paddle in community. Take the time to learn how to paddle with others effectively. There are lots of different strokes, different talents and energy levels. They will all come in handy as we float down the river together.

Someone has to steer. We can take turns but only one direction at a time, please.

Even though we may be in separate canoes and there are diverse readings of the map, there is only one river and whether we recognize it or not we are all heading in the same direction.

Music, laughter and singing are always good travelling companions. They help, especially when our muscles and spirits are bone tired.

Don't forget to stop along the way and listen to the silence and the water lapping at the boat. Beauty surrounds us.

Paddling, both the fun part and the hard-work part, takes passionate and steady engagement.

Paddling together with friends makes life worth the living, especially when the currents are strong."

# Our History: Chapter One

The Unitarian Church got its start in Edmonton in 1912, died in the late 1930s due to the Great Depression, and was born again in 1954. Here's one tidbit from that long history:

The first permanent minister of the congregation was Rev. Charles Potter, who started here in 1914. He was an American, and he passionately opposed the First World War which had broken out that year. The leading layman of the congregation was Prof. W.H. Alexander, who was deeply involved in supporting the Canadian troops. He was a leader of the Canadian Officers in Training Corps on the U of Alberta campus, and co-authored a monthly newsletter for Edmontonians in the trenches.

Not surprisingly, the two didn't agree. Among other things, they fought over prayers for the soldiers at our Unitarian services. Their clashes led to Potter's departure in 1916. Potter would go on to be a noted public speaker; he often gave a talk on his time in Edmonton, called Buffalos and Brussels Sprouts.

The Unitarian Church of Edmonton is a liberal, multi-generational, religious community. We celebrate a rich mosaic of free-thinking, spiritually-questing individuals joined in common support and action. We welcome diversity including diversity of beliefs from divine believers to humanists, from pagans to atheists and agnostics. We believe in the compassion of the human heart, the warmth of community, the pursuit of justice and the search of meaning in our lives.

We gather with gratitude on traditional Cree lands that are now a part of Treaty Six and shared by many nations. A treaty is an inheritance, a responsibility and a relationship. May we be good neighbours to one another, good stewards to our planet and good ancestors to our children.
