September Theme: The Journey from Here to There

August 30: Coffee With the UCE Board on Zoom 10:30am MT We will have a short question and answer session followed by regular coffee hour.

September 6: Justice, Justice Shalt Thou Pursue

Rev. Lee Anne Washington will introduce herself to us by sharing her journey from pursuing legal justice in state and federal courts in the United States to pursuing social justice through the co-creation and support of beloved communities.

September 13: Leaving Egypt in Faith

Every journey from here to there begins with moving away from that which has become familiar and moving toward possibilities that have not yet manifested -- that takes faith. Rev. Lee Anne Washington will introduce us to the work of interim ministry through exploration of the ancient story of the Israelite's exodus from Egypt.

September 20: The Gifts of Wandering through the Wilderness

Likening the interim period between settled ministers to the Israelites' wandering through the wilderness, Rev. Lee Anne Washington will explore how such wandering can be a time of great spiritual growth, self-actualization, and discovery for our congregation. Though the interim period can be uncomfortable at times, it is by exploring our discomfort and by holding each other in love that the gifts we have to offer our beloved community and our next settled minister emerge.

September 27: A Rose by Any Other Name ...

What do we call this "thing" that we "do" on Sunday morning? How do we do it? We'll explore what we think and how we feel about the ways we "do" our Sunday gatherings and how we draw from world religions and philosophies to inspire us in our ethical and spiritual life.


RETURN TO SERVICES IN UCE BUILDING SURVEY


The current COVID-19 pandemic has produced some really important changes in the formats of social gatherings and worship services, in particular. June 22, 2020 the AHS has updated the requirements for reopening worship services and public spaces. The UCE Board felt it was important to gauge the congregational views on this important topic.

Methodology: Accordingly, a survey was prepared and distributed to the current UCE members and friends. The survey consisted of a series of nine questions, most of which had an option to provide comments or alternatives. A tenth section for open-ended comments was also included. The survey was e-mailed out to 215 participants. UCE received 91 responses online and two hard copy for a total of 93. This represents a response rate of 43%. Statistically this means a Margin of Error of 8% with a confidence level of 95%. This is considered a valid result.

Survey Results:


1. **Respondent's age:** Just over 50% of the respondents identified as being 66 years old or older. This is in the AHS high risk criteria.






2. **Respondent's current spiritual needs:** The overall response placed at 3.56 which puts it midway between Neutral (25.29%) and Good (55.17%).


3. Respondent's community participation: Respondents were offered a list of seven Almost 80% have formats. attended Sunday Zoom services and about 32% had stayed for Sunday coffee hour. One area of note was that about 22.5% of respondents had not attended any of the UCE community opportunities.




4. **Appropriate timing to resuming onsite Sunday services:** Respondents were offered a list of seven criteria. The results were mixed. Of note, the sum of the responses, After Jan 2021, May 2021, After a vaccine, and After 2 weeks of 0 new cases was the majority at 51%.




5. **Respondent's willingness to run streaming services:** The leading response was an unconditional "No" at 53%.





6. Respondent's willingness to reserve attendance spot ahead of time: The use of online booking service would prevent overcrowding in the Sanctuary. Current AHS recommendations limit the number congregants the Sanctuary can accommodate on a given Sunday. Almost two-thirds (63%) of respondents would be willing to use a reservation system to attend Sunday services.

7. Respondent's willingness to arrange sanctuary furniture for Sunday services: Of the participants in the survey, 40% responded No. Comments included that they would not feel safe at this time to handle chairs.




8. Considering your risk factor will you choose to stay at home and watch zoom services?

8. Respondent's choice of using remote services vs. personal attendance: The respondents split fairly evenly between using remote or personal attendance for services delivery.

9. **Respondent's opinion on opening UCE building to renters:** Just under half (44%) of the respondents thought that UCE should reinstate the casual renter program. A further 29% were Not Sure.



Conclusions:

The range of responses to most questions varied widely. Likewise, the written comments yielded a wide range of ideas and concerns. The overarching conclusion is that members are unsure and that caution should be applied for all future decisions.


Recommendations: The UCE Board considered the survey results at the August 12, 2020 board meeting. Some of the findings and motions that were passed in our special summer Board meeting were as follows:

- UCE will continue with Zoom services on Sundays, as well as other virtual gatherings, for the foreseeable future. There will be no in person services during this time. The board and the minister will continuously evaluate the COVID-19 situation, monitor guidelines from Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health and the provincial government, and will provide the congregation with updates.
- The church building will not be open for use by UCE groups or committees at this time, with the exception of the Building and Grounds Tuesday Maintenance Crew. The situation will be reevaluated on an ongoing basis by the board and minister.
- The rental committee are contacting the existing casual renters of the building and compiling more information for the Board to make recommendations in the September Board Meeting.
- Our church administrator, Janet, will begin working from within the church building with safety measures put in place by the Building and HR committees. We hope that this will eliminate the issues that we have been having with sending email remotely and allow easier access to files for Janet's convenience. No "in person" meetings will be scheduled with Janet for the foreseeable future.
- The arrival date and end of the 14 day quarantine period for Rev Lee Anne Washington is still not determined but is now expected to be close to mid/end October.
- A further idea that arose from the survey is that a significant number of members prefer remote access to UCE services. This will be explored further even after the COVID-19 issue passes. It and will address the inclusivity concept inherent in UCE principles and allow UCE to have further outreach and presence in the community at large.

CUC Releases Statement On Guaranteed Income – August 5, 2020

Poverty and economic instability have profound effects on the health, education, social engagement and inclusion, and future economic prospects of those who experience them. Poverty disproportionately affects children, women and racialized and marginalized communities including those with disabilities. In 2018, 8 percent of all children, and 1 in 4 children living in families with single mothers, were living in poverty.

The statistics are far worse for Indigenous communities. The Assembly of First Nations reported in 2019 the following statistics for children living in poverty: 47% of Status First Nation (53% for those living on reserve and 41% for those living off-reserve); 25% of Inuit children; 22% of Métis children; and 32% of non-status First Nations children.

As Unitarian Universalists, we believe that all Canadian residents, regardless of age, gender, ability or race, deserve to live with dignity. In our affluent country, no one should be forced to make choices between adequate housing, nutritious food, or medical needs.

CUC Releases Statement On Police Violence Against Indigenous People – June 20, 2020

In 2020, more Indigenous people have died as a direct result of their interactions with Canadian police forces. Most recently the deaths of Chantal Moore and Rodney Levi in New Brunswick, and Eisha Hudson, Jason Collins, and Stewart Kevin Andrews in Winnipeg have illustrated the tragic results of the systemic oppressions and discrimination within our social and justice systems. Representing a community of faith which believes in the inherent worth and dignity of all, the Canadian Unitarian Council calls on the Government of Canada and the provincial and territorial governments to implement changes to policing to better protect racialized populations. Priority should be given to implementing existing recommendations, such as those of The National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG), and to developing police approaches which are responsive, accountable, culturally appropriate, and anti-racist. We again urge the federal government to issue their plan to implement the recommendations within the MMIWG report.

We call on all police forces across the country to acknowledge systemic racism and its impact on the health and safety of Indigenous people who have interactions with police. We further call on all police forces to review and revise how they interact with Indigenous, Black and other racialized people, and with those with mental health and addiction issues, making de-escalation tactics the standard. Police forces, their leaders and individual officers must be held publicly accountable for their actions. Police forces, and their oversight bodies must actively work to diversify their members by increasing the representation of racialized communities in their ranks.

Further, we encourage Unitarian Universalists to contact their police forces and all levels of government to urge the enactment of these changes that are needed, and such as those <u>recommended by the Ontario Human Rights Commission</u>. None of us can afford to be silent any longer. The time for change is now. ~ From the CUC's National Voice Team: UU Ministers of Canada President, Rev.
