January 17, 2021 World Religion Day

Celebrated around the world, World Religion Day is an observance initiated in 1950 by the National Spiritual Assembly of the Baha'is of the United States. It is celebrated on the third Sunday in January every year. It arises from the Baha'i principle of the oneness of religion (literally "bond") and of progressive revelation, which describes religion as continuously evolving. Rev. Lee Anne will lead us in imagining a world in which all people adhere to the basic principles of the Baha'i faith.

January 24, 2021 Laughter is the Best Medicine -- Belly Laugh Day

Some believe that humor depends upon the perception of an appropriate incongruity. And, that a good sense of humor depends on the ability to imagine alternative outcomes. Positive laughter fuels positive energy, connection, and creativity. Have you ever had such a good laugh that you cried? Remember how you felt immediately afterward? Laughing out loud releases a neurotransmitter in the brain called serotonin, which relieves stress, reduces tension, and eases the symptoms of depression. Windmill Point road terminates at the river's edge. Our failure to stop would have plunged us headlong into the cold waters of the Rappahannock River. Fortunately, I stopped just in time.

Once stopped, I left the car running for the heater's warmth, unbuckled my seatbelt, turned sideways in my seat, electronically rolled down my window, placed a throw pillow on the window ledge to protect my back, and leaned out as far as I could. Lucy did the same on her side. We looked up into the night sky eagerly awaiting sight of the Geminid meteor shower. And, we were not disappointed. During this time of COVID-19 restrictions, many of us are living alone without the physical comfort and intellectual stimulation of our friends and family. Even those of us who share our living quarters have relationship challenges that are exacerbated by unrelenting togetherness in limited spaces.

So, what can we offer each other to cure social isolation or social oversaturation? An opportunity to connect and spend time with someone else is just the antidote to both situations.

To test this cure, you are invited to join us *via* Zoom on Saturday nights in January from 7 to 10 pm beginning January 9th. Maximizing the flexibility of Zoom, we will offer a casual and free-flowing experience. You may choose to join a planned activity or just hang out.

We will create as many breakout rooms as often as we need -- so you may move in and out of as many conversations as you want. Even the planned activities will be unstructured and casual so that you can drop in at any time. Here's the schedule:

January 9, 2021: (Sharing stories about death and dying led by Rev. Lee Anne) Many of us have comforting, moving, or inspiring stories about events around the death of friends and family which we do not often share. Rev. Lee Anne has two. What about you? Come share your story and be inspired by the stories of others. We will also facilitate small group discussions and free-ranging conversations.

January 16, 2021: (Sharing our religious/spiritual experiences led by Rev. Lee Anne) Few of us live a full life without experiencing moments of profound awe, or moments of self-realization, or moments of unbridled joy that have a sacred aura about them. Come share your story and be inspired by the stories of others. We will also facilitate small group discussions and free-ranging conversations.

January 23, 2021: (Fun and Games -- a multigenerational opportunity to play games) Come out all you mature, middle-aged, young, and young at heart to play with us. Some games will be online, others will simply be adapted to the Zoom environment. Do some research, bring your ideas, and help us make this evening a joyful and playful event. We will also facilitate small group discussions and free-ranging conversations.

January 30, 2021: (Composing, Speaking, Singing Practice Poetry, led by Rev. Audrey Brooks). There's inspiration for poetry everywhere if you know how to look for it. And, this is practice poetry -- no judgment. You don't have to be good at it. Just give it a try. You might surprise yourself. We will also facilitate small group discussions and free-ranging conversations.
