

When I was a kid, my feet were rarely confined to a pair of shoes. Living on a dairy farm with an orchard did pose a few problems (use your imagination), however, I was not deterred. I remember being able to even walk on the rocky shores of Cultus Lake to the amazement of my elders. "Don't those rocks hurt your feet?" I'd get asked. No, my feet were tough and calloused and stained from the dirt, and I loved the feel of the earth or grass or hay beneath my feet. Earlier this year, I decided to stop wearing shoes so much, I felt like my feet were missing out. Sometimes I remember my decision, sometimes I don't, but the experience has been lovely. My feet will never be as calloused (or dirty) as they were when I was that kid that roamed barefoot in the fields, but I am finding the experience delightful.

This month we are focusing on delight. Kahlil Gibran alludes to what brings us delight. Engagement with nature, others, our pets, and our being. We, as a species have developed to need community, to need beauty, and to be curious. Our first service this month is Flower Communion, bringing our need for beauty right into the sanctuary. June 11th will have us regaling in laughter as our pets join us! Our animal companions mean so much to us, and we do them and each other honour as we meet to bless them together. The third service will celebrate us in our being. No one person is the same as the next. We are a mix, a constellation if you will. Who are we attracted to affectionally and informally, how do we feel about who we are inside, what makes us feel something? These things and more get thrown into the giant mixer and we come out so delightful! Let's delightfully celebrate that beauty together on June 18th for our annual Pride service.

The natural world is there for us to delight it. May you find moments this month to remember to bask in that delight.

### **The Principles and Sources of our Religious Faith**

UU congregations affirm and promote eight principles, which we hold as strong values and moral guides. As Rev. Barbara Wells ten Hove explains, "The principles are not dogma or doctrine, but rather a guide for those of us who choose to join and participate in UU religious communities."

#### **Our Eight Principles**

- The inherent worth and dignity of every person;
- Justice, equity, and compassion in human relations;
- Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;
- A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;
- The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;
- The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;
- Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.
- Individual and communal action that accountably dismantles racism and systemic
- barriers to full inclusion in ourselves and our institutions

We live out these principles within a "living tradition" of wisdom and spirituality, drawn from such diverse sources as science, poetry, scripture, and personal experience.

#### **Our Six Sources**


- Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
- Words and deeds of prophetic people which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;
- Wisdom from the world's religions which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;
- Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbours as ourselves;
- Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;
- Spiritual teachings of Earth-centred traditions which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.
- Grateful for the religious pluralism which enriches and ennobles our faith, we are inspired to deepen our understanding and expand our vision. As free congregations we enter into this covenant, promising to one another our mutual trust and support.

### Listen Everywhere

We have installed the Listen Everywhere service to replace our aging FM radios. This system will be in use for every service and available everywhere in the Church building and some of the parking lot.

To use the system, you will need to download and install the Listen Everywhere app from the google store, or apple store and you will need to connect to the UCE WIFI (password posted in church). Once you have done both steps, just open the app and start the session. It allows you to listen using your own headset, wireless earbuds, or if your phone is connected to your hearing aids, you will hear it there. Just as if you are listening to a phone call.

We will have people around to help if you need it, please ask.
