



May's Ministerial Reflections



May has finally arrived! Things will be buzzing here at UCE this month. We are hosting the CanUUdle gathering, the Chorus gathering will also be in Edmonton at Westwood, and the Installment and Celebration will be happening here on May 19th.

You might be wondering what an installment is and why we are having one. An installment is a service that publicly recognizes the relationship between a congregation and the minister they have recently called to be their settled minister. There is generally an understanding that the minister and the congregation are a pretty good fit, that they can work together to accomplish tasks, and that they can look into the future and decide on direction and goals

When UCE first hired me, I was hired on a contract basis. After a year and a half, some members of the congregation decided it was a good idea to 'settle' me here. Things were going well and we seemed to be a good match. A process was set into motion where folks got to discuss and think about whether or not I was to be 'called.' After that, there was a successful vote and a new type of contract was drawn up between us, one that acknowledges our new way of relating to one another. There was a tremendous amount of thought and care that went into this process. The benefit to a congregation in having a settled minister is that there is a knowledge that we are going to work hard together, that we're in it for the long haul. Together, we want to make this the best congregation we can. It also means that we are both settled in that knowledge, even though it is clear that we certainly didn't 'settle' for one another. Having chosen a minister to be with a congregation not for a set amount of time, but for as long as it is a positive and healthy relationship.

I am delighted and honoured to be the ninth settled minister for The Unitarian Church of Edmonton. I am excited about our celebration to mark this auspicious occasion, and very much looking forward to working with the wonderful people here at UCE in the coming years.

I know we will accomplish great things together!

UCE ROOF UPDATE

West Point Roofing got started on our new roof on Monday, April 15th. By the time you read this they will be mostly done. This morning (Tue Apr 23) they were working on the East building, and it looked like they would finish in a day. They still had a line of roofing to do over our church offices but that should also be done this week. It may be a couple of weeks until all the metal flashing is completed but the roof will be fully waterproof by the end of April.

Today, we started replacing the ceiling tiles in the hallways and taking the plastic down from the work room and the nursery. The plastic will stay in the southeast offices until the roof is complete later this week. Replacement ceiling tiles are on order and will be here in about 4 weeks.

The good news is that there was very little damage to the roof that required extras. They also were able to attach underneath our roof-top furnaces without having to disconnect and lift them. They only had to remove one heating duct for a day. I'll give a final update at the AGM, but for now the roof looks good.



The Principles and Sources of our Religious Faith

UU congregations affirm and promote eight principles, which we hold as strong values and moral guides. As Rev. Barbara Wells ten Hove explains, "The principles are not dogma or doctrine, but rather a guide for those of us who choose to join and participate in UU religious communities."

Our Eight Principles

- The inherent worth and dignity of every person;
- Justice, equity, and compassion in human relations;
- Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;
- A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;
- The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;
- The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;
- Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.
- Individual and communal action that accountably dismantles racism and systemic
- barriers to full inclusion in ourselves and our institutions

We live out these principles within a "living tradition" of wisdom and spirituality, drawn from such diverse sources as science, poetry, scripture, and personal experience.

Our Six Sources

- Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
- Words and deeds of prophetic people which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;
- Wisdom from the world's religions which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;
- Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbours as ourselves;
- Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;
- Spiritual teachings of Earth-centred traditions which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.
- Grateful for the religious pluralism which enriches and ennobles our faith, we are inspired to deepen our understanding and expand our vision. As free congregations we enter into this covenant, promising to one another our mutual trust and support.

Listen Everywhere



We have installed the Listen Everywhere service to replace our aging FM radios. This system will be in use for every service and available everywhere in the Church building and some of the parking lot.

To use the system, you will need to download and install the Listen Everywhere app from the google store, or apple store and you will need to connect to the UCE WIFI (password posted in church). Once you have done both steps, just open the app and start the session. It allows you to listen using your own headset, wireless earbuds, or if your phone is connected to your hearing aids, you will hear it there. Just as if you are listening to a phone call.
