

March's Ministerial Reflections

Quote – Khalil Gibran

When you are joyous, look deep into your heart and you shall find it is only that which has given you sorrow that is giving you joy. When you are sorrowful look again in your heart, and you shall see that in truth you are weeping for that which has been your delight.

Here we are in April, and when I write this the snow is falling and the roads are treacherous. The snow is making me very unhappy today, and yet, while I was sledding not long ago, it brought me so much joy. Joy is the theme for this month, and it is indeed a complicated emotion as Kahlil Gibran points out.

Joy and sorrow, though fleeting, are the emotions that often define our lives. We strive to be happy, to find joy, and we try very hard to avoid sorrow. However, they are deeply intertwined, you can't have one without the other. We know what to do with joy, we simply en-JOY it! Do we know what to do though, when sorrow hits, as it will to everyone experiencing this human existence?

For me, when sorrow presents itself, I need to talk about it. Some need to be still and guiet to think and process, while others push the unpleasantness aside and try to carry on. Being part of a congregation, having a 'church' family if you will, gives us the structure to experience these strong emotions safely.

When joy is abundant in our lives, we can share it with friends, family, and on Sunday mornings here at UCE. Joy shared, as they say, is joy multiplied.

When sorrow, the flip side of joy strikes, UCE is here to support you. Come to a Sunday service and talk about it during coffee time. During the check in at a meeting you can share your sorrow and have kind people hear you. Also, being part of this community means you have access to professional ministry that includes pastoral care.

As we explore the concept of joy in April, let's be ever mindful that joy, and sorrow, are part of who we are and even though what we seek is joy, we must be prepared to handle sorrow.

...Vital Volunteerism! That's what UCE is built on. If you think about it – even for a few seconds – you realize that without volunteers we would not have a church – period.

A full-time minister and part-time administrator are the only paid staff right now. Everything else that keeps UCE operating relies on volunteers. That includes activities and events for raising money.

Spring is a big time for fundraising events – the Casino, April 21 and 22, and the Garage Sale, May 1 to 3. The casino needs a few more back-up workers who could be called on to fill in for any spots on short notice. The garage sale will require dozens of contributors to donate items and to work on many tasks for pre-sale, sale days and post-sale needs. You'll find more details about both fundraisers in this newsletter and/or the Friday email.

Those are the most pressing volunteer needs right now. But opportunities to serve your church are abundant. Organizing Sunday morning greeters is one of those, as Jennifer Hinchcliffe has retired her clipboard. Attending the CUC annual meeting as a UCE delegate is another current need.

Every one of us has a special gift or talent to bring to the life of our church. We see that in all our many wonderful volunteers right now. So seriously consider saying "yes" to calls for help. Benefits will accrue to you, the volunteer, as well. Consider these wise words from my AI friend, Gemini:

Volunteering provides a sense of purpose and satisfaction. It can reduce stress, combat loneliness and promote overall well being. It helps individuals feel more connected to their community and strengthens a sense of belonging. In essence, volunteerism creates a mutually beneficial relationship where both the cause and the volunteers experience positive outcomes.

Request for CUC Delegate

Our church can send three delegates to the annual general meeting of the national organization, the Canadian Unitarian Council, which will happen on Zoom on Saturday, May 31. Rev. This year's canvass ended on Sunday March 30th, but there are still a couple of days in April to submit a pledge until we close off our numbers.

If you have not pledged yet, then do it now with this link please.

We prepare our canvass plan in November, launch canvass in the January newsletter, send out letters to our donors with their tax receipts in February, and then speak in church every Sunday in March to get people to pledge.

Once March is done, we tally the pledges, complete the acknowledgements, add in any monthly donors that forgot to pledge, and then call anyone that was missed. By the end of the first week in April I sit down and figure out an estimate of next year's donations based on pledges. If canvass is successful then I write up my canvass report and I'm done. If canvass comes up short, then we may have to pull out the budget and make cuts.

As I write this newsletter article, I do not yet know what the final canvass amount will be. I will report the final amount at the AGM on May 4th. I just hope that enough people took Just One Step to support the work of our church.

The Principles and Sources of our Religious Faith

UU congregations affirm and promote eight principles, which we hold as strong values and moral guides. As Rev. Barbara Wells ten Hove explains, "The principles are not dogma or doctrine, but rather a guide for those of us who choose to join and participate in UU religious communities."

Our Eight Principles

- The inherent worth and dignity of every person;
- Justice, equity, and compassion in human relations;
- Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;
- A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;
- The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;
- The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;
- Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.
- Individual and communal action that accountably dismantles racism and systemic
- barriers to full inclusion in ourselves and our institutions

We live out these principles within a "living tradition" of wisdom and spirituality, drawn from such diverse sources as science, poetry, scripture, and personal experience.

Our Six Sources

- Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
- Words and deeds of prophetic people which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;
- Wisdom from the world's religions which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;
- Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbours as ourselves;
- Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;
- Spiritual teachings of Earth-centred traditions which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.
- Grateful for the religious pluralism which enriches and ennobles our faith, we are inspired to deepen our understanding and expand our vision. As free congregations we enter into this covenant, promising to one another our mutual trust and support.
